

#### Prime Minister Naftali Bennett led a historically comprehensive coalition that represented parties from the right, left and centre, including the first independent Arab party to be part of

a governing coalition. It fell apart after defections from two right-wing members, differing ideologies within, and a wave of Palestinian attacks in Israel sparking criticism of the government. 
