Abstract

The Middle East is currently undergoing long-overdue religious reform aimed at aligning religious practices with modern societal needs and national aspirations. These reforms, however, are specific to the region and should not be applied universally. Instead, other regions, such as South and South-east Asia, must pursue their own localised religious reforms that better reflect their distinct cultural identities, legal frameworks, and social contexts.

This session will explore the significant role of religious leaders and their influence on both local and global Muslim communities. It will also highlight how nations like Singapore can adapt religious practices to honour their local heritage, uphold the Constitution, and foster harmony among diverse religious communities.

Additionally, he founded and currently chairs the World Council of Muslim Communities, the Manara Regional Center for Coexistence and was the first Secretary-General of the Muslim Council of Elders.
